## Charles Herman Harper

We were not going to accept anything some things we just had to take. Some of you next to his wife, Dorothy, in Calumet Park Cememight know who Charlie Harper was, he's the tery. guy riding all over town the last dozen years or so, on his 3 wheel bike. When he retired from worked with bought him the bike. Charlie was legally blind and depended on others for transportation. He was so happy and proud of that bike. We have a picture of him on his bike and a copy of an article written about him years ago.

When Charlie passed away a little over a month ago, his family found that his insurance policy had lapsed in just the recent year. Charlie had fallen at home and broke his femur about two years ago. After surgery and rehab he was able to return home but was never back to his old self. He tried to ride his bike but the pain was too bad and then this past spring he injured his leg again and they had to do surgery as he was in so much pain. He was at the nursing home for rehab when he started with other health issues which he could not overcome.

This is when his sister learned about his insurance policy. Word got out and the Portage community all came together and collected the money needed to pay for the expenses. many came to his funeral, and Father Corona from Nativity paid him a great tribute at the funeral service.

After the service, Bill Mesich acquired his bike from the family and had it brought to the museum. We have it on display and already two different times people had come in that didn't know Charlie and right away remembered seeing him around town on the bike.

Services were held for Charlie at the Rees until after the move to the barn is complete but Funeral Home, Olson Chapel, and he was buried

We will keep his spirit alive at the Portage the Portage Street Department, the guys he Historical Society Museum in Countryside Park with his bike and picture on display. It's not just an ordinary bike, he has added several things to



it like the license plate given to him for his many years of service to the Portage Street Department.
